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METHODOLOGY

This research study was commissioned by Joy Junction in order to measure residents' attitudes and opinions relating to homelessness in the Albuquerque area.

THE INTERVIEW

A random sample of 500 residents living in the Albuquerque area (excluding Northern Rio Rancho) was interviewed by telephone. Telephone numbers were generated from the Research & Polling, Inc. database. All interviews were conducted between December 16 and December 23, 2016.

The telephone interviewers are professionals who are brought together for a training session prior to each survey. This ensures their complete and consistent understanding of the survey instrument.

MARGIN OF ERROR

A sample size of 500 at a 95% confidence level provides a maximum margin of error of approximately 4.6%. In theory, in 95 out of 100 cases, the results based on a sample of 500 will differ by no more than 4.6 percentage points in either direction from what would have been obtained by interviewing all residents in the Albuquerque area.

SAMPLE BIAS

In any survey, there are some respondents who will refuse to speak to the professional interviewer. A lower response rate among certain types of individuals can result in a sample wherein certain types of individuals are over-represented or under-represented. The potential for sampling bias increases as the response rate decreases. Research & Polling, Inc. often sets quotas for various segments of the population who are historically undercounted. This has the effect of minimizing, but not necessarily eliminating, sampling bias.

THE REPORT

This report summarizes the results from each question in the survey and reports on any variances in attitude or perception, where significant, among demographic subgroups. The subgroups examined in this report include:

- Region
- Gender
- Ethnicity
- Age
- Household income
- Education attainment level
- Political philosophy
- Attendance of religious services

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

PERCEIVED SERIOUSNESS OF HOMELESSNESS IN ALBUQUERQUE

Residents in the Albuquerque Metro area express a high level of concern about homelessness. In fact, seven-in-ten residents believe homelessness is a problem facing Albuquerque with 43% who say it is a *very serious problem*.

It is important to note that Hispanics, those with a household income less than \$60,000, and residents living in the Valley/Downtown and Mid-Heights are more likely than others to feel homelessness is a *very serious problem* in Albuquerque.

PERCEIVED CAUSES OF HOMELESSNESS

The large majority of residents believe drug abuse (87%), alcohol abuse (84%) and mental illness (78%) are the biggest causes of homelessness in Albuquerque. The majority of residents also believe that economic factors such as job loss/unemployment (62%) and insufficient income (59%) play an important role in homelessness.

Interestingly, many residents (54%) believe that poor decision making and laziness are factors that contribute to homelessness. In comparison, less than half of area residents believe factors such as domestic violence (45%), lack of affordable housing (37%) or physical disabilities (40%) are major reasons for homelessness in Albuquerque.

When asked what is the single most important or *primary reason* for homelessness in Albuquerque, the plurality of residents cite drug use (34%) which is mentioned nearly twice as often as mental illness (18%). Falling just behind mental illness, 13% of residents say poor decisions and laziness is the single biggest cause of homelessness.

PERCEPTIONS OF THE HOMELESS

The survey results suggest that some residents have misperceptions or a lack of information about the homeless in Albuquerque, though it

is encouraging that most residents appear to be sympathetic to the issue. Some of the key observations:

- > Two-thirds of residents disagree with the statement that it is hard to understand how anyone can become homeless.
- ➤ Residents are twice as likely to agree than disagree that most homeless people want to get a stable job (44% and 21%, respectively).
- Residents are almost equally apt to agree (35%) than disagree (29%) that men are more likely than women to become homeless.
- Although the plurality (44%) disagree that homeless people are more likely to commit crimes than other people, 30% do believe the homeless commit more crimes.
- Residents are twice as likely to disagree (40%) than agree (21%) that only a small percentage of homeless are families with children. Many residents (39%) have a neutral or no opinion.
- A slight majority of residents (51%) disagree that most homeless people are only homeless for a short period of time (just 12% do believe most people are only homeless temporarily).

These results show that there are misperceptions and/or lack of awareness about the composition of the homeless in Albuquerque. Joy Junction may want to focus future advertising and outreach campaigns on trying to educate the public about these misperceptions.

ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS IN ALBUQUERQUE

Relatively few residents (17%) believe Albuquerque is doing a good job addressing homelessness in Albuquerque. The plurality (42%) of residents believes that Albuquerque is doing a poor job addressing the issue, while many (33%) have a mixed/neutral opinion.

Most residents (62%) believe that homelessness has increased in the city over the last five years compared to just 6% who feel there has been a decrease in homelessness. In this context, it is easy to understand why some many people are critical of how well the homeless issue is being addressed in Albuquerque.

Nearly two-thirds of residents (63%) believe that private charities need more public assistance to help address homelessness in Albuquerque and 60% do not believe there are enough homeless shelters in the city to meet the demand. This is encouraging news and shows there really is a perceived need for more private solutions to the homeless issue and an expansion of services. The challenge is how to tap into this public sentiment to encourage more residents to donate to private organizations, which is made all that more challenging by the continued economic stagnation in the state.

AWARENESS AND PERCEPTIONS OF JOY JUNCTION

Joy Junction is the most well-known of the organizations or groups that work to help the homeless in Albuquerque and enjoys a very positive reputation among area residents. When asked in an unaided, open-ended manner what organization/group helping the homeless first comes to mind, nearly half of the survey respondents mention Joy Junction compared to just 14% who mention Albuquerque Rescue Mission and 10% who mention St. Martin's.

Ninety-two percent of Albuquerque area residents say they have heard of Joy Junction and 70% say they have a favorable opinion of Joy Junction compared to just 5% who view the organization unfavorably.

Joy Junction is clearly doing a good job when it comes to advertising as over three-quarters (78%) recall seeing, hearing, or reading an advertisement. Among those who have heard of Joy Junction, 41% recall seeing an advertisement (or possibly a news story) about the

organization on television, while 17% recall receiving a mailing and 17% recall hearing about Joy Junction on the radio.

Although most residents have heard of Joy Junction and have a favorable opinion of the organization, it would appear that many do not know a lot about it. For example, less than half (43%) of those who have heard of Joy Junction are aware that it is a faith-based organization.

When it comes to importance of being a faith-based organization, residents appear to have somewhat mixed opinions. While nearly half (49%) say it is important for an organization helping the homeless to be faith-based, 36% feel it is unimportant and 13% say it does not matter one way or the other. Residents who attend church more often, are philosophically conservative, Hispanic, or have lower educational attainment levels are more likely than others to say being faith-based is important to them.

Furthermore, while 26% of residents say they would be more likely to donate to an organization helping the homeless that is faith-based, 8% are less likely to do so, and 64% say it would not make a difference.

PANHANDLING

Nearly two-thirds (65%) of Albuquerque residents believe that panhandling in Albuquerque has *increased* over the last five years, compared to 24% who feel the occurrence of panhandling has *stayed* about the same and just 6% feel it has decreased.

Just over half (52%) of Albuquerque residents say they have heard of the City's "There's A Better Way" program designed to address panhandling. Among those who have heard of the program, 32% of residents feel it has been effective thus far (as indicated by a score of 4 or 5), while 31% do not believe it has been effective (a score of 1 or 2), and 30% have neutral or mixed feelings (a score of 3).

When asked in an unaided, open-ended manner what are the biggest problems or issues facing Albuquerque today, 42% of area residents say the crime rate is high, while 11% mention lack of jobs/unemployment and another 11% mention drug/alcohol abuse. One-in-ten residents say homelessness is the biggest problem facing Albuquerque today.

Interestingly, residents with a household income of \$60,000 or higher are much more likely than those earning less than \$60,000 to mention the crime rate (56% and 40%, respectively).

Residents were read various issues facing residents in Albuquerque and asked to rate how serious of a problem each one is using a 5-point scale where 5 is a *very serious problem* and 1 is *no problem at all*. Not surprisingly, **crime** is rated as the most serious issue facing Albuquerque with 84% of residents saying it is problem (a score of 4 or 5) and 59% saying crime is a *very serious problem*.

Seven-in-ten Albuquerque area residents rate **homelessness** as a problem facing the city with 43% who feel it is a *very serious problem*. Just under one-in-ten residents do not view homelessness as a problem facing the city (a score of 1 or 2), while 20% rate this as a moderate problem as indicated by a score of 3.

Residents who are more likely to feel homelessness is a very serious problem include:

- Hispanics (49%) compared to Anglos (36%)
- Those with a household income less than \$60,000 a year (49%) compared to those earning \$60,000 or more a year (33%)
- Those living in the Mid-Heights (52%) and Valley/Downtown area (51%) compared to those living in the Far Heights (36%), Westside/Rio Rancho (41%) or other outlying areas of the Albuquerque Metro area (31%).

The majority of residents (57%) view **panhandling** as a problem in the community with 36% saying it is a *very serious problem*. One-in-five residents appear to view panhandling as a minor problem or *no problem at all* (a score of 1 or 2), while 23% rate this as a moderate problem (a score of 3).

The majority of area residents feel the lack of good paying jobs (59%) and the quality of public school education (52%) are problems facing residents, while less than two-fifths (38%) believe lack of affordable housing is a problem.

Residents were asked in an unaided, open-ended manner what they believe are the primary reasons why a person becomes homeless. As shown above, the plurality of residents (38%) feel **drug abuse** is the primary cause of homelessness, while 27% believe it is **mental illness/PTSD**, and 22% feel it is **job loss/unemployment**.

Other commonly mentioned causes of homelessness include lack of good paying jobs (13%), alcohol abuse (12%), insufficient income (10%), laziness (8%), poor decisions (8%) and poor/lack of education (8%).

Area residents were asked how to rate much they believe various factors contribute to becoming homeless in Albuquerque using a 5-point scale where a score 5 is a *major reason* a score of 1 is *no reason at all*.

Overall, residents rate **drug abuse** (87%) and **alcohol abuse** (84%) the biggest contributors of being homeless in Albuquerque (as indicated by a score of 4 or 5), with just 3% each who say these are not reasons (a score of 1 or 2) for being homeless.

Over three-quarters (78%) of residents feel **mental illness** plays a large role in becoming homeless in Albuquerque (50% say it is a *major reason*). Those with a graduate degree are more likely than others to say mental illness is a *major reason* for becoming homeless.

[†] The Mean score is derived by taking the average score based on the 5-point scale. The Major Reason response is assigned a value of 5; the No Reason At All response is assigned a value of 1. The Don't Know/Won't Say responses are excluded from the calculation of the Mean.

Between approximately half and three-fifths of area residents believe each of the following economic issues contribute to being homeless in Albuquerque:

- Job loss/unemployment (62%)
- Insufficient income (59%)
- Lack of good paying jobs (49%)

Further, 37% of residents rate **lack of affordable housing** as a factor to becoming homeless in Albuquerque. However, 34% have a neutral opinion and another one-quarter say this is not a factor.

Generally speaking, those of lower socio-economic status are more likely than others to cite each of the above economic issues as reasons that can contribute to being homeless in Albuquerque. For example, 78% of residents with a household income of less than \$20,000 feel **insufficient income** is a reason (or *major reason*) for homelessness compared to 55% of those with a household income of \$60,000 or higher.

Just over half of residents say **poor decisions/laziness** (54%) and **poor/lack of education** (51%) are contributing factors to homelessness in Albuquerque, though approximately one-quarter disagree. Interestingly, males (60%), Hispanics (61%), and those of lower socio-economic status are more likely than others to say poor decisions/laziness is a factor, while seniors (63%) are more likely than others to say poor/lack of education is a factor.

Forty-five percent of residents believe **domestic violence** is a contributing factor to homelessness, while 27% have mixed feelings and 24% say it is a minor/no reason at all. Among women, 52% say domestic violence is a factor in being homeless in Albuquerque compared to 38% of men. Further, seniors (58%), those earning less than \$20,000 (56%), and those with a graduate degree (56%) are more likely than others to say domestic violence is a contributing factor.

Two-fifths of residents believe **physical disabilities** are a factor that contributes to becoming homeless in Albuquerque, while 26% have mixed feelings and three-in-ten do not view physical disabilities as a reason homelessness.

After respondents rated each of the different reasons that may contribute to becoming homeless in Albuquerque, they were reminded of the reasons they rated the highest and asked which one they believe is the *primary cause* of homelessness in Albuquerque.

One-third (34%) of residents say **drug abuse** is the primary cause of homelessness, with younger residents more likely than others to say this is the primary cause.


Eighteen percent of residents say **mental illness** is the primary cause of homelessness. Those with a graduate degree are more likely to say this is the primary cause of homelessness is Albuquerque.

Thirteen percent of residents feel **poor decisions/laziness** is the primary cause of homelessness in Albuquerque.

When taken together, 22% of residents attribute economic issues such a **job loss/unemployment** (9%), **lack of good paying jobs** (6%), **insufficient income** (6%), and **lack of affordable** housing (1%) as being the primary causes of homelessness.

It should be noted that 44% of residents under the age of 35 say drug abuse is the primary cause of homelessness compared to just 23% of seniors. One-in-four seniors say either poor decisions/laziness (18%) and poor/lack of education (8%) are the primary causes of homelessness.


One-in-three residents who have a graduate degree say mental illness is the primary cause of homelessness.



Residents were asked to rate **how well they feel homelessness is being addressed in Albuquerque**, using a 5-point scale where a score of 5 is an *excellent job* and a score of 1 is a *very poor job*. Overall, 42% of residents feel Albuquerque is doing a poor job of addressing homelessness (as indicated by a score of 1 or 2) compared to just 17% who feel a good job is being done (a score of 4 or 5). One-third have mixed feelings about how well homelessness is being addressed.

Residents who are more apt to feel Albuquerque is doing a poor job of addressing homelessness include:

- Hispanic residents (47%) compared to Anglos (38%)
- Those under the age of 50 (49%) compared to seniors (31%)
- Those with a household income less than \$20,000 (49%)
- Residents living on the Westside/Rio Rancho area (54%)



The majority (62%) of residents say **homelessness in Albuquerque** has *increased* over the past five years, while one-quarter say it has *stayed about* the same and just 6% say it has *decreased*.

Residents were read various statements relating to homelessness and **asked how strongly they either agree or disagree with each one**, using a five-point scale where a score of five is *strongly agree* and a score of one is *strongly disagree*.

"Private charities need more public support to help address homelessness"

Sixty-three percent of residents agree (37% strongly agree) private charities need more public support to help address homelessness, while 19% have mixed feelings and 14% disagree. Women (45%) and those earning less than \$20,000 (55%) are more likely than others to strongly agree.

"Most homeless people want to get a stable job"

Over two-fifths (44%) of residents agree most homeless people want to get a stable job, with one-fifth who *strongly agree*. However, 31% have mixed feelings, and another 21% disagree. Those with a graduate degree (54%) and those in the Mid-Heights area (55%) are more likely than others to agree most homeless want to get a job.

"Given the opportunity, most homeless people could take care of a home"

Two-fifths (41%) of residents agree that given the opportunity, most homeless people could take care of a home, with 15% who *strongly agree*. Three-in-ten (31%) have mixed feelings, and another 23% disagree. Anglos (47%), those earning less than \$20,000 (48%) and those earning between \$40,000 and \$59,999 (57%) are more likely than others to agree homeless people could take care of a home if given the opportunity.

"Men are more likely than women to become homeless"

Just over one-third (35%) of residents agree that men are more likely than women to become homeless, with just 17% who *strongly agree*. However, approximately three-in-ten residents disagree (29%) and another 29% have mixed feelings.

"Homeless people are more likely to commit crimes than other people."

Although the plurality of residents (44%) do <u>not</u> believe that homeless people are more likely to commit crimes than are other people, three-in-ten respondents do think crime is more prevalent among the homeless.

"Only a small percentage of the homeless are families with children."

Residents are twice as likely to disagree (40%) that only a small percentage of homeless are families with children as they are to agree (21%). Many residents (39%) either have a neutral opinion or said they don't know (9%).

"There are enough homeless shelters in Albuquerque to meet the demand."

Three-in-five residents disagree there are enough homeless shelters in Albuquerque to meet the demand compared to 17% who feel there are currently enough shelters. Approximately one-in-four residents either don't know or have a neutral opinion. Women are more inclined than men to *strongly disagree* there are enough homeless shelters (45% and 29%, respectively).

"It's hard to understand how anyone can become homeless."

Two-thirds of residents disagree that it is hard to understand how anyone can become homeless with 47% who *strongly disagree*. Just 14% of residents say they do have a hard time understanding how someone becomes homeless.

"Most homeless people are only homeless for a short period of time."

Approximately half of area residents disagree that most homeless people are only homeless for a short period of time, rather they would appear to believe that homelessness is systemic. Just 12% of residents believe that most homeless people are only homeless for a short period of time.

Residents were asked, in an unaided, open-ended manner, which groups and organizations that are working to help the homeless in Albuquerque first come to mind.

Nearly half (49%) of residents mention Joy Junction, compared to 14% who mention the Albuquerque Rescue Mission, 10% mention St. Martin's Hospitality Center/homeless shelter, and 9% mention the Salvation Army. Notably, one-quarter of residents did not mention a particular group or organization.

Of note, Anglos (57%) and those ages 50 to 64 (57%) are more likely than others to mention Joy Junction. Just 34% of residents under the age of 35 mention Joy Junction. Over one-third (35%) of younger residents could not think of any organizations/groups that help the homeless in Albuquerque.

Residents were read the names of various homeless-related organizations operating in Albuquerque and asked to **rate their opinion of each one**, using a five-point scale where a score of five is *very favorable* and a score of one is *very unfavorable*.

Overall, Joy Junction is the best known and most well-respected of the organizations tested. Over nine-in-ten (92%) of residents say they have at least heard of Joy Junction and 70% have a favorable opinion of the organization. In comparison, just 5% of area residents have an unfavorable opinion of Joy Junction.

- Women (49%) are more inclined than men (35%) to say they have a *very favorable* opinion of Joy Junction. Furthermore, Hispanics (48%) are more likely than Anglos (39%) to have a *very favorable* opinion.
- Nearly one-in-four residents under the age of 35 either have never heard of Joy Junction (16%) or have no opinion of the organization (6%).

In comparison, 79% of residents say they have heard of the **Albuquerque Rescue Mission**, with 48% who have a favorable opinion and just 3% who have an unfavorable opinion. Many residents (16%) say they have heard of the Albuquerque Rescue Mission, but do not have an opinion about it.

The majority (57%) of area residents say they have heard of the **St. Martin's Hospitality Center/Homeless Shelters**, with 35% who have a favorable opinion and just 2% who have an unfavorable opinion.

Just 36% of area residents say they have heard of the **The Rock At NoonDay** making it the least well known of the homeless organizations tested.

When asked in an unaided manner to give the reasons for their opinion of Joy Junction 25% of respondents say the organization helps the homeless, while 22% say it does good work, 20% mention good reputation, 15% cite helping families, and 11% say Joy Junction provides shelter.

The most frequently mentioned criticism of Joy Junction is that it has a poor/bad reputation (5%).


Residents who are aware of Joy Junction were given some brief background information about the organization and then asked if they have seen or heard any advertisements, and if so, where they saw or heard the ads.

Nearly four-in-five respondents say they have seen ads for Joy Junction, with 41% saying they saw a TV ad, while 17% say they recall seeing a mailing, another 17% heard a radio ad, and 9% recall reading about Joy Junction in the newspaper.

Age: Residents age 50 and over are much more likely than younger residents to recall having seen something about Joy Junction on television (54% and 29%, respectively). One-third of seniors also recall receiving a mailing compared to just 4% of those under the age of 35.

Nearly two-fifths (38%) of residents under the age of 35 who are aware of Joy Junction do <u>not</u> recall seeing any advertisements for the organization.


Gender: Women are more apt than men to recall receiving a mailing from Joy Junction (24% and 9%, respectively).




Forty-three percent of residents who are aware of Joy Junction are also aware that is a faith-based organization. However, 9% mistakenly believe Joy Junction is not a faith-based organization, while 48% are unsure.

Respondents who are more inclined to be aware that Joy Junction is a faith-based organization include

- Women (48%) compared to men (37%)
- Anglos (51%) compared to Hispanics (35%)
- Those who know someone who has been homeless (48%) compared to those who do not (33%)






Overall, nearly half of area residents feel it is either *very important* (29%) or *somewhat important* (20%) that an organization that helps homeless people be faith-based. However, 36% believe being faith-based is either *somewhat unimportant* or *very unimportant* and 13% say it *does not matter*.

Residents who are more inclined to feel being faith-based is important include:


- Those who identify as conservatives (65%) compared to moderates (49%) and liberals (29%)
- Those who attend church at least once a week (77%) and those who attend church one or twice a month (57%) compared to those who attend a few times a year (41%) or seldom/never (24%)
- Hispanics (56%) compared to Anglos (42%)
- Those with lower levels of formal education (62% among those with a high school education or less compared to 33% among those who have completed graduate school)

When asked if they would be more or less likely to donate to an organization helping the homeless that is faith-based, the large majority say it would not make a difference, though 26% say they would be more likely to donate to a faith-based organization and 8% would be less likely to do so.


• Nearly two-fifths of those who identify as being conservative are *more likely* to donate to a faith-based organization compared to 20% of moderates and just 15% of liberals. Seventeen percent of liberal are less likely to donate to a faith-based organization.




Two-thirds of Albuquerque residents say they know someone who has been homeless at some point. Interestingly, seniors (56%) are least apt to know someone who has been homeless.



Nearly two-thirds (65%) of Albuquerque residents believe that panhandling in Albuquerque has *increased* over the last five years, compared to 24% who feel the occurrence of panhandling has as *stayed about the same* and just 6% feel it has decreased.

After being given a description, just over half (52%) of Albuquerque residents say they have heard of the City's "There's A Better Way" program which is designed to address panhandling. Awareness of the program is highest among:

- Anglos (62%) compared to Hispanics (46%)
- Those age 50 and over (66%) compared to those under the age of 35 (32%)
- Those with a household income of \$80,000 or more (67%)
- Those with at least a four year college degree (65%) compared to those with some college experience or less (46%)

Residents were also asked to rate how effect they believe the "There's A Better Way" program has been in addressing panhandling in Albuquerque using a 5-point scale where 5 is very effective and 1 is not effective at all.

Overall, 22% of residents feel the program has been effective thus far (as indicated by a score of 4 or 5), while 29% do not believe it has been effective (a score of 1 or 2), and 21% have neutral or mixed feelings (a score of 3). Many residents (28%) have not formed an opinion about the effectiveness of the program. Residents who have heard of the "There's Better Way" program are also polarized in their opinions as 32% feel it has been effective, while 31% disagree and 30% have neutral/mixed feelings.
